EDL Bylaw, Memorandum of Understanding March 2016

Membership:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Twenty-five (25) member Board of Directors including four (4) citizen appointments ratified by City Council representing seniors, environment, multi-cultural and indigenous, the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor (rotates every six months) and City Manager as permanent members, as well as appointments from the University of Lethbridge, Lethbridge College, Lethbridge Chamber of Commerce and Lethbridge County. The remaining fourteen (14) representatives from key sectors such as Agriculture, Arts & Culture, Commercial, Construction, Finance, Industrial, Not-for-Profit, Regional, Retail, Service, Sports & Recreation, Technical/Research, Tourism and Transportation. • Two (2) year terms - Four (4) year maximum • A member may be asked to resign from the Board if the member has three unexcused absences annually from regular meetings • In the event that EDL is required to report to City Council, it will report to the Economic Standing Policy Committee.
