Guidelines

- Prohibited materials: do not burn treated or painted lumber, wood containing glue or resin, wet or unseasoned wood, green wood, yard waste, deadfall, branches, leaves, garbage, rubber, or plastic.
- Safety distance: ensure fit pits or portable fire receptacles are at least 1.5 metres away from buildings, structures, or combustible materials.
- Portable fire receptacles: follow the manufacturer's safety guidelines.
- Fire pit size and flames: fire pits must be no larger than 1 metre at their widest point, and flame heights cannot exceed 1 metre.
- Supervision and extinguishing: always have a means to extinguish the fire, and never leave it unattended. Ensure it is completely extinguished before leaving the area.
- Prohibited hours: fire pits may not be used between 1:30 a.m. and 8:00 a.m.

Penalties

- Burning prohibited materials: \$150
- Burning during prohibited hours: \$150
- Burning during fire ban: \$200

 Note: propane fire receptacles are approved for use during a fire ban
- Burning when wind speeds exceed 30 km/h: \$150


