

Bill 37 - Alberta Prompt Payment and Construction Lien Act

On August 29, 2022, the Alberta Prompt Payment and Construction Lien Act will become new legislation in the province of Alberta. This act will serve as the replacement to the current Builders' Lien Act, and it will introduce several measures to provide consistency in the construction industry. By speeding up the payment process and adding alternatives to the Courts to provide dispute resolutions relating to payments under a contract during the project, the Alberta Prompt Payment and Construction Lien Act aligns with the modernized approaches of other Canadian jurisdictions. The key changes that will affect the City of Lethbridge are as followed:

Mandatory Prompt Payment Cycle

- The City is now required to pay an invoice within twenty-eight (28) days from the receipt of a proper invoice. This is a change from the current thirty (30) days;
- The City must provide a Notice of Dispute for any work done that does not meet City standards within **fourteen (14) days** from the receipt of a proper invoice;

Lien Extensions

• The period for filing a lien has been extended from forty-five (45) days to sixty (60) days.

The City of Lethbridge Procurement Department has taken comprehensive steps to ensure our internal capabilities and practices deliver the desired service level needed to meet the new requirements. The steps taken to date are outlined below:

- Updated the Vendor Address Book in JD Edwards to accommodate for the change from Net30 to Net28.
- Developed training materials to supplement the implementation of this new legislation to
 ensure internal stakeholders are well prepared to manage this new process and reduce any
 inherent or compliancy based risk.
