Who We Are

City Scholars is a City of Lethbridge program that provides opportunities for collaboration between post-secondary students, faculty, and City of Lethbridge staff.

Globally, municipalities face complex social, economic, and environmental challenges as they work to deliver the plans, programs, and services that their residents and businesses rely on.

The City Scholars Program creates a pathway for students, faculty, and the City to work together on evidence-informed applied research projects that support innovation, and address challenges and opportunities we face. Through collaboration, we can better understand the needs of our diverse community, the impacts of local and global changes, and ultimately design and deliver high-quality planning, programs, and services to our community.

How We Work

City Scholars creates a unique opportunity for collaboration through Work-Integrated Learning and Applied Research Partnerships.

Work-Integrated Learning (WIL)

WIL projects provide students with hands-on workplace experience, structured around both professional and academic outcomes. At the City of Lethbridge students have the unique opportunity to work on projects that positively impact the wellbeing of their community, while also benefiting from the mentorship of City and faculty supervisors. The skills and experiences gained through City Scholars' WIL opportunities support students as they enter the workforce and/or pursue further education.

Applied Research Partnerships (ARP)

Applied research grounds theory in real-world settings, such as within a neighbourhood or a City department. City Scholars' ARPs exist between the City of Lethbridge and postsecondary institutions and seek to impact the way we design and deliver planning, programs, and services. ARPs can be proposed by either City staff who have an operational need that requires research support, or by faculty and students who wish to advance research that results in benefits to the City and community.

City Scholars brings together post-secondary students, faculty, and City staff through WIL and ARP projects. We create the necessary connections to ensure that each partner contributes to and benefits from collaborative work and research opportunities.
